<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Applicant's operating authority was restated by Decision No. 63984 dated July 24, 1962. In the Mojave Desert area applicant was granted twenty-mile lateral rights to the east of U. S. Highway 99 and to the north of Los Angeles Basin Territory as defined in Appendix B to said decision. Desert Express and Victorville-Barstow Truck Line filed a petition for rehearing involving this desert area, only. The Commission granted this petition on November 7, 1962.

Applicant and the principal protestant-petitioner, Desert Express, thereupon entered into protracted negotiations looking toward a compromise of their differences.

On April 22 the parties filed a stipulation covering the situation. Applicant accepts a restriction of its lateral rights to five miles east of U. S. Highway 99 and five miles north of the northerly line of Los Angeles Basin Territory, Highway 99 to Yucaipa. The protestant-petitioner agrees that if such an exception is placed in the certificate its petition for rebearing may be considered withdrawn and dismissed.

Based on the stipulation of the parties, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity will not in the future require the services of Merchants Express of California, a corporation, at points more than five miles east of U.S. Highway 99

between Eakersfield and the northerly boundary line of Los Angeles Basin Territory nor more than five miles northerly of the northerly boundary line of Los Angeles Basin Territory between U. S. Highway 99 and Yucaipa except such points as are within five miles easterly of U. S. Highway 99.

It has also come to our attention that the limitations with respect to the transportation of explosives and other dangerous articles now contained in applicant's certificate are more restrictive than intended by the order in Decision No. 63984. This matter will be corrected by the order herein.

The Commission concludes, therefore, that Appendix A of Decision No. 63984 should be amended in the manner encompassed by the ensuing order.

A public rehearing is not necessary.

<u>O R D E R</u>

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Appendix A of Decision No. 63984 is amended by incorporating therein First Revised Pages 1, 2 and 3 and Original Page 4, attached hereto, in revision of Original Pages 1, 2 and 3.

2. As herein amended, Decision No. 63984 in this proceeding shall be continued in full force and effect.

First Revised Page 1 Cancels Original Page 1

Merchants Express of California, a corporation, is authorized to transport property as follows:

GENERAL COMMODITIES, except:

- 1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
- 2. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
- 3. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
- 4. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
- 5. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses, bus chassis.
- 6. Articles of extraordinary value as set forth in Rule 3 of Western Classification 77, J. P. Hackler, Tariff Publishing Officer, on the issue date thereof.
- Explosives as described in and subject to the regulations of American Trucking Associations, Inc., Agent, Motor Carriers' Explosives and Dangerous Articles Tariff 11, Cal.P.U.C. 6, F.G. Freund, Issuing Officer.


MERCHANIS EXPRESS OF CALIFORNIA First Revised Page 2 (a corporation) Cancels Original Page 2

Between all points and places on the highways or within the area hereinafter enumerated, including points and places within twenty miles of the enumerated highways and points and places within twenty miles of the boundary of the described area except where different mileage is specifically noted:

- 1. An area bounded by a line commencing at the Pacific Ocean west of Westport; thence, cast along an imaginary line to Pulga; thence, southeeast along an imaginary line to Nevada City; thence, southerly along State Highway 49 to Mariposa; thence, southwesterly along State Highway 140 to Merced; thence, southerly along U.S. Highway 99 to the northern boundary of the Los Angeles Basin Territory (described in Appendix B attached hereto); thence, easterly and southerly along U.S. Highway 395 to Sam Diego; thence, southerly along U.S. Highway 101 to San Ysidro; thence, west to the Pacific Ocean; thence, northerly along the coastline of the Pacific Ocean to the point of beginning. (See Exceptions 1, 2 and 4.)
 - 2. U.S. Highways 99, 99E and 99W between the California-Oregon border and the northern boundary of the area described in No. 1 above.
 - 3. U.S. Highway 101 between Crescent City and the northern boundary of the area described in No. 1 above. Off-route service limited to points and places within 10 miles of this route. (See Exception 3.)
 - 4. State Highway 108 between Sonora and Strawberry.
 - 5. State Highway 120 between junction State Highway 49 (near Jacksonville) and Yosemite National Park.

- EXCEPTION 1: Merchants Express of California is not authorized hereunder to serve from, to or between points and places located over and along State Highway 140 or within five miles laterally thereof between Yosemite and a point one mile east of Merced, except points and places within 25 miles of U.S. Highway 99.
- EXCEPTION 2: Merchants Express of California is not authorized hereunder to serve points and places more than 20 miles west of U.S. Highway 101 between Santa Rosa and Longvale, both inclusive.
- EXCEPTION 3: Merchants Express of California is not authorized hereunder to serve the following:
 - (1) Korbel and Blue Lake and all other points and places on U.S. Highway 299 within 10 miles of U.S. Highway 101.
 - (2) Hydesville and all points and places located on the county road from Fortuna to Hydesville via Rohnerville, all points and places on State Highway 36 east of Hydesville within 10 miles of U.S. Highway 101, and all points and places on county roads from junction State Highway 36 and county road near Bridgeville to Fort Seward, Alderpoint and Zenia within 10 miles of U.S. Highway 101.
- EXCEPTION 4: Merchants Express of California is not authorized hereunder to serve any point more than five miles east of U.S. Highway 99 in the area between Bakersfield and the northern boundary of the Los Angeles Basin Territory as defined in Appendix "B" (except as otherwise authorized) nor is it authorized to serve any point more than five miles north of the northerly boundary of the Los Angeles Basin

MERCHANIS EXPRESS OF CALIFORNIA Original Page 4 (a corporation)

> Territory between its intersection with U.S. Highway 99 and Yucaipa as defined in Appendix "B" (except that it may serve such points as may lie within five miles laterally of U.S. Highway 99).

Merchants Express of California may use any street, road, highway, ferry or toll bridge necessary or convenient in performing the service herein authorized, and may establish through routes and rates between any and all points and places authorized to be served.

Miles and lateral miles referred to in this appendix are statute miles of 5,280 feet each, measured in a straight line without regard to terrain features.

To the extent of any duplication of operative rights set forth in this appendix, such operative rights may not be separated to permit Merchants Express of California to sell or transfer one certificate authority and retain another certificate authority to perform the same service.
