O R D E R

Pacific Electric Railway Company is hereby authorized to construct a drill track at grade across Slauson Avenue, in the City of Santa Fe Springs, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 6C-15.80-C. Upon completion of the above crossing, the existing crossing of Slauson Avenue (Crossing No. 6C-15.38-C) shall be abolished by physical removal.

Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. The width of the crossing shall be 80 feet, and grades of approach not exceeding one percent, in accordance with plan attached to application. Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B). Back lights may be omitted on the signals located on the center median.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

Applicant declares that the facility to be served is in urgent need of rail service and accordingly requests waiver of the twenty-day waiting period.

The effective date of this order shall therefore be the date hereof.
