FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 61438, dated February 7, 1961, as amended, the Commission granted to Mountain Shadows Water Company a permit to issue not to exceed \$30,140 of common stock on or before June 30, 1963, and a certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct and operate a water system in Kern County. The decision provided that the authorization therein granted would expire if not exercised within one year after the effective date of the order.

The company reports that it has not yet started construction of its system but that it expects to do so forthwith and to complete the project later this year. It requests an extension of time.

The Commission has considered this matter and is of the opinion, and finds, that a public hearing is not necessary; that the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for by the issue of said stock is reasonably required for the purposes referred to in Decision No. 61438, which purposes are not, in

whole or in part, reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income; and that the company's request should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Order in Decision No. 61438, dated February 7, 1961, hereby is amended to provide that the authorization therein granted will expire if not exercised on or before December 31, 1963.

2. Mountain Shadows Water Company may issue, at par, not to exceed \$30,140 aggregate par value of its common stock on or before December 31, 1963, for the purposes referred to in said Decision No. 61438.

3. This First Supplemental Order is effective on the date hereof.
