## ORDER CONTINUING SUSPENSION OF CERTIFICATE

The certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by G & G Trucking Company (G & G) has been suspended since February 11, 1963, under the provisions of General Order No. 100-B for failure to have on file requisite evidence of liability insurance. The carrier has not filed the required evidence of liability insurance since that date.

The Commission received a copy of a cancellation notice dated April 16, 1963, addressed to G & G whereby Western Classification Committee, Agent, notified it that its participation in Western Classification 78 would be canceled effective July 20, 1963.

Subsequently, by letter from the Secretary of the Commission, G & G was placed on notice that its highway common carrier operative right would be subject to suspension or revocation, pursuant to lawful procedures, should it fail to maintain a classification in effect.

The publishing agent filed with this Commission a tariff revision

The certificate authorizes service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of specified commodities between a defined Los Angeles Drayage Area, on the one hand, and Oakland and San Francisco, on the other hand.

unless before such effective date G & G Trucking Company shall have filed with this Commission a written request for public hearing or shall have filed the proper and lawful freight classification required by Sections 486 and 493 of the Public Utilities Code in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
