ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

POSEY WILLIAMS, of 1501 East 23rd Street, Los Angeles, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that complainant was a user of public telephone service furnished by defendant under number RI 8-9029; that on or about July 17, 1963, the telephone facilities were disconnected by defendant and complainant was advised that permission would have to be obtained from the Public Utilities Commission prior to restoration of service; that complainant did not use and does not now intend to use said telephone facilities as instrumentalities to violate the law, nor in aiding or abetting such violation; that complainant was arrested with another man who had come into his place of business to use the public telephone on about June 8, 1963, on a charge of violating the Penal Code; that complainant was released on bail and later informed that there were no charges against him; that complainant's dry cleaning business without a telephone has suffered a loss of about 50% in business; that complainant seeks restoration of telephone service forthwith; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, is hereby directed to reconnect and restore telephone service to complainant and to maintain such service pending further Commission order herein, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply within ten (10) days after said service.
2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
