#### Abstract

APplication of THE GREYHOUND CORPORATION ) EOE authority to reroutc its operations ) between West Vlacerville Junction and EI Dorado Fairgrounds Overcrossing, over ; relocated U. S. Highway 50, EI Dorado Coumty, and for incidental relief.

OPINIQN

The Greyhound Corporation requests suthority to renoute its operations between West Placerville Juction and El Doxado Fairgrounds Overcrossing, over relocated U. S. Highway 50.

In order to incorporate the above requested authority into applicant's cortificate, it is only required that Route No. 3.07 as presently described be reauthorized as of current date in adoption of the new highway between the concerned points.

It is alleged that U. S. Highway 50 has been in process of zeconstruction and relocation between West Placerville Junction and a point just south of the El Dorado County Fairgrounds, herein referred to as "El Dorado Fairgrounds Overcrossing", for a distance OE approxinately 1.6 miles; accoxding to applicant's latest information, the present U. S. Fighway 50 between the concerned points wiil revert to the County and become an unumbered highway when the new segment of highway is opened to prabice use on or about September 1 , 2963; this new segment of highway is a four-Iane, divided, limitedaccess freeway built to the most modem standards of engineering and safety; applicant's present route between hest Placerville and the

EI Dorado Fairgrounds is over a heavily congested, much traveled urban area route with stop signs, signal lights, cross traffic, pedestrian traffic, crrb parking and necessarily reduced speed limits; due to the large number of various business establishments located along the present U. S. Highway 50, hazards to safety and consequent delays are continaliy encountered on the presently authorfzed route; adoptzon of the new freeway for use will enable applicant to eliminate approximately one-third of the mileage between the concenned points and to avoid the hazards and delays encountered on the present route.

After consideration the Comission finds that prolic convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

## QRDER

IT IS ORDERED that:
I. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to The Greyhound Corporation, authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger.stage corporation, as that term is defined in Section 226 of the PubIic Utilitics Code, for the Eransportation of passengers, baggage and express between the points and over the routes set forth in Fifth Revised Page 6, attached hercto, as an extension and enlargement of, consolidation with and subject to all the limitations and restrictions set forth in the cercificate granted by Decision No. 55893 and in parcicular subject to the provisions set forth in Section 3 of Appendix A thereof.
2. Appendix A of Decision No. 55893 is hereby amended by incorporating Fifth Revised Page 6 in revision of Fourth Revised Page 6.
3. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
(b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in the Commission's office in triplicate tariffs and timetables satisfactory to the Commission.
(c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission one the public, and the effectrive date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
(d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79 and 98.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

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3.05 - Between Squaw Valley Junction and Squaw Valley:

From junction California E゙ighway 89 and unumbered higiway (Squaw Valley Junction), ovex ummbered highway to Squaw Valley.

Regulariy scineduled service is authorized to be conducted during the sumer season only. Senvice in Special Operations may be conducted throughout the year.
3.06 - Between Cal-Neva and Tahoe City:

From the point where CaliEomia Eifyway 28 contacts the Nevada-Califomia State Line (Cal-Neva), over Califormia Highway 23 to jumetion Califomia Kighway 89 (Tahoe Cicy).
Service is authorized to be conducted in Special Operations only.
*3.07 - Between the Nevaca-California Siate Linc east of Lakeside, and Sacramento:

From the point where U. S. Xighway 50 intersects the Nevada-Califormia State Iine, over U. S. Highway 50 to junction unambered highway (East Folsom Junction), chence over unmmbered hizhway via Folsom to junction U. S. Highway 50 (Alder Creck Junction), thence over U. S. Jighway 50 to Sacramento.

Scheduled operations between the Nevada-California State line and Placerville are authorized only for rendition of sumer-season service, provided that scheduled sexvice shall be resumed during the remainder of the year with not less than one round trip per weck in and when justified by traffic demands. Service in Special Operations may be conducted throughout the year.
3.08 - Between Diamond Springs Crossroads and El Dorado Junction:

From Diamond Springs Crossroads, over umambered highway via Diamond Sprinas and El Dorado to junction U.S. Highway 50 (EI Dorado Junction).
