O R D E R

City of Port Hueneme is hereby authorized to construct Willard Way at grade across the Main Line of the Ventura County Railway Company, at the location described in the application, as amended August 26, 1963, to be identified as Crossing No. 45-5.61, in the City of Port Hueneme, County of Ventura.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Ventura County Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines.

Width of the crossing shall be 64 feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent in accordance with plans attached to the application. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B), with reflex reflecting sheet material.

Upon completion of Crossing No. 45-5.61, the existing crossing of Willard Way, formerly Ormond Beach Boulevard (Crossing No. 45-5.64), shall be physically abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
