Application of the State of California, Department of Public Works, for an order authorizing construction of a crossing at separated grades and the closing of an existing crossing at grade over the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company, in connection with the improvement of State Route IV-SC1-114-A, in the County of Santa Clara, referred to as the "Mountain View Overhead".

O R D E R

State of California, Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to construct State Route 114 at separated grades over the track of Southern Pacific Company, in Mountain View, Santa Clara County, at the location and substantially as shown by map (Exhibit B) attached to the application referred to as "Mountain View Overhead", to be identified as Crossing No. E-36.5-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.


Upon completion of the grade separation authorized herein, Southern Pacific Company shall abolish grade Crossing No. E-36.5, Easy Street, by physical closing and removal.

Concurrently with the issuance of this decision the Commission is instituting an investigation on its own motion into conditions at the nearby grade crossing of Whisman Road, Crossing No. E-36.8.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years, unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
