OPINION

The Gray Line, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as Gray Line) and Fialer's Limousines, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as Fialer's) request authority to sell and transfer and The Greyhound Corporation (hereinafter referred to as Greyhound) and Golden Gate Charter Car Service. Inc. (hereinafter referred to as Golden Gate) request authority to purchase and acquire certain property, equipment, operating authority and good will.

Gray Line and Fialer's are presently operating as passenger stage corporations and are the solely owned subsidiaries of Avis Rent-a-Car System, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as Avis). Greyhound is engaged as a passenger stage corporation between points throughout the Sille of California, Golden Gate, a solely owned subsidiary of Greyhound, is presently engaged in the transportation of mail between San Francisco and Willits pursuant to a contract with the United States Government. Golden Gate is not presently operating as a passenger stage corporation.

said property on the ground that the office activities presently conducted at said building by Gray Line would henceforth be conducted at Greyhound's office at 371 Market Street, San Francisco, and said property would no longer be necessary or useful in connection with the public utility operations of Golden Gate.

As of May 31, 1963, Greyhound indicated a net worth in the amount of \$147,528,334 and for the first five months of 1963 indicated a net income in the amount of \$6,922,111.

It is alleged that within the past few months Avis has determined to withdraw from the business of operating buses and to concentrate upon its rent-a-car business; following certain negotiations Avis entered into an agreement with Greyhound; Greyhound also operates a luxury sightseeing business through its wholly owned subsidiary California Parlor Car Tours Company; the acquisition of the operating rights and properties of Gray Line and Fialer's will supplement the existing operations of Greyhound and California Parlor Car Tours Company; and use of Greyhound's office and terminal facilities will help to reduce operating costs and to improve service.

On October 7, 1963, the Chauffeurs Union Local 265 petitioned to intervene for the purpose of assuring that the public interest and the interests of the Gray Line drivers are properly provided for. In response thereto, The Greyhound Corporation has indicated its intention to hire the Gray Line drivers. Should that intention not be carried out, the Commission, upon proper application, will reopen this proceeding for consideration of such issue.

After consideration the Commission finds that:

- 1. The proposed sale would not be adverse to the public interest.
- 2. The property located at 425 Fourth Street after the transfer herein authorized, will be no longer necessary or useful in public utility operations and may, therefore, be withdrawn from public use.

consummation of the transfer herein authorized. The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79 and 98.

- 4. Effective concurrently with the tariff and timetable filings as required by ordering paragraph 3 hereof a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Golden Gate Charter Car Service, Inc., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes more particularly set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 5. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, Golden Gate Charter Car Service, Inc., shall comply with and observe the following service regulation:

Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, Golden Gate Charter Car Service, Inc., shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, Golden Gate Charter Car Service, Inc., is placed on notice that it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98 and insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101-A. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Orders Nos. 98 and 101-A, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

6. Effective concurrently with the tariff and timetable filings as required by ordering paragraph 3 hereof, all operating

rights previously granted to Fialer's Limousines, Inc., and to The Gray Line, Inc., are revoked; including but not limited to the following:
