## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 66195, entered today in Case
No. 5432, et al., the Commission found that Minimum Rate Tariff
No. 2 and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 should be amended to refer to
the Exception Rating Tariff established by that decision as a tariff
governing the application of the rates and charges in said minimum
rate tariffs.

The aforesaid decision also found that in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 should be amended by a separate order.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix D to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective December 28, 1963, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A also attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

- 2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than December 28, 1963; and the tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.
- 3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 4. In all other respects Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Item SECTION NO. 1 - RULES AND REGULATIONS OF GENERAL APPLICATION

# DEFINITION OF TECHNICAL TERMS (Items Nos. 10 and 11)

ARMORED CAR means any motor truck and/or other highway vehicle which has been armored with bullet resistant metal and/or bullet proof glass, and which is manned by an armed crew.

CARRIER means a radial highway common carrier or a highway contract carrier as defined in the Highway Carriers' Act, or a household goods carrier as defined in the Household Goods Carriers Act.

CARRIER'S EQUIPMENT means any motor truck or other self-propelled highway vehicle, trailer, semi-trailer, or any combination of such highway vehicles operated as a single unit.

COMMON CARRIER RATE means any intrastate rate or rates of any common carrier or common carriers, as defined in the Public Utilities Act, lawfully on file with the Commission and in effect at time of shipment; any interstate or foreign rate or rates of any common carrier railroad or railroads applying between points in California by an interstate or foreign route, lawfully in effect at time of shipment; also any interstate or foreign rate or rates of any common carrier or common carriers, as defined in the Public Utilities Act, applying between points in California and in effect at time of shipment and covering transportation exempt from rate regulation of the Interstate Commerce Commission under Section 203(b)(6) or Section 203(b)(8) of Part II of the Interstate Commerce Act.

CONSIGNOR means the person, firm or corporation shown on the shipping document as the shipper of the property received by the carrier for transportation.

DISTANCE TABLE means Distance Table No. 4, amondments thereto or reissues thereof.

ESCORT SERVICE means the furnishing of pilot cars or vehicles by a carrier as may be required by any governmental agency to accompany a shipment for highway safety.

ESTABLISHED DEPOT means a freight terminal owned or leased and maintained by a carrier for the receipt and delivery of shipments.

\*EXCEPTION RATINGS TARIFF means Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 and supplements thereto or reissues thereof issued by the Commission.

øEXCEPTION SHEET means Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 and supplements thereto or reissues thereof issued by the Commission.

INDEPENDENT-CONTRACTOR SUBHAULER means any carrier who renders service for a principal carrier, for a specified recompense, for a specified result, under the control of the principal as to the result of the work only and not as to the means by which such result is accomplished.

MULTIPLE LOT SHIPMENT means a shipment transported in accordance with the provisions of Item No. 85 or 86.

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PALLETIZED SHIPMENT means a snipment tendered to and transported by the carrier on pallets (elevating-truck pallets or platforms or lift-truck skids, with or without standing sides or ends, but without tops).

PERMIT SHIPMENT means a shipment which because of its width, length, height, weight or size requires special authority from a governmental agency regulating the use of highways, roads or streets for the transportation of such shipment in whole or in part.

PICKUP AND DELIVERY CHARGE means the full charge applicable Without the deduction authorized by Item No. 110.

FOINT OF DESTINATION means the precise location at which property is tendered for physical delivery into the custody of the consignee or his agent. All points within a single industrial plant or receiving area of one consignee shall be considered as one point of destination. An industrial plant or receiving area of one consignee shall include only contiguous property which shall not be deemed separate if intersected only by public street or thoroughfare.

POINT OF ORIGIN means the precise location at which property is physically delivered by the consignor or his agent into the custody of the carrier for transportation. All points within a single industrial plant or shipping area of one consignor shall be considered as one point of origin. An industrial plant or shipping area of one consignor shall include only contiguous property which shall not be deemed separate if intersected only by public street or thoroughfare.

NOTE 4.-Exemption applies only as to dried fruit in the natural state and which has not been cleaned, washed, stemmed or otherwise prepared or partially prepared for human consumption.

NOTE 5.-Exemption does not apply to sea shells as described in Item No. 653.

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## NCTE 6.-Exemption applies only to seeds to be sown or planted, viz.:

NOTE 8.—Exemption will not apply to transportation for which rates are provided in Items Nos. 315 and 605.

NOTE 11.—Exemption applies only to transportation between points within a radius of 25 miles of the intersection of 1st and Main Streets, Los angeles, said mileage to be computed in accordance with the provisions of Item No. 100.

NOTE 12.-Exemption applies only to transportation between points located within the Los Angeles Basin Territory as described in Item No. 270.

NOTE 13.-Exemption expires with March 4, 1964.

- NOTE 2.-Length not to exceed 24 feet, except Poles and Piling which shall not exceed 50 feet in length.
- NOTE 3.-Applies on Boards or Sheets, flat, sawdust or ground wood, preservatively treated or not treated, but not plasticized, with or without added resin binder not exceeding 10 percent by weight, compressed. Metal Molding or Fasteners may be included in the shipment with Boards or Sheets but shall not exceed 5 percent of the weight of the entire shipment.
