SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. ______, entered today in Case No. 5432, et al., the Commission found that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 should be amended to refer to the Exception Rating Tariff established by that decision as a tariff governing the application of the rates and charges in said minimum rate tariffs.

The aforesaid decision also found that in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 should be amended by separate order.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 (Appendix A to Decision No. 32504, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective December 28, 1963, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A also attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than December 28, 1963; and the tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects Decision No. 32504, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

RATE includes charge, and also the ratings, minimum weight, rules and regulations governing, and the accessorial charges applying in connection therewith.

SAME TRANSPORTATION means transportation of the same kind and quantity of property and subject to the same limitations, conditions and privileges, although not necessarily in an identical type of equipment.

SHIPMENT means a quantity of freight tendered by one shipper on one shipping document at one point of origin at one time for one consignee at one point of destination. (See also Split Delivery Shipment.)
