SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

66268

By Decision No. \_\_\_\_\_, entered today, in Case No. 5432, et al., the Commission found that various minimum rate tariffs should be amended to reflect substitution of National Motor Freight Classification A-7 for Western Classification No. 78. The decision also found that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B should be amended by separate order.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (Appendix "B" of Decision No. 65834, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective December 29, 1963, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than December 29, 1963; and the tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, Decision No. 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

POINT OF DESTINATION means the precise location at which property is tendered for physical delivery into the custody of the consignee or his agent.

POINT OF ORIGIN means the precise location at which property is physically delivered by the consignor or his agent into the custody of the carrier for transportation.
