ORDER MODIFYING DECISION NO. 64905

By letter dated November 5, 1963, Security Transportation Co. has requested authority to make the tariff filings required by ordering paragraph 5 of Decision No. 64905 effective on ten days' notice to the Commission and the public. It is stated that the Interstate Commerce Commission has authorized acquisition of the interstate certificate of Security Truck Lines by Security Transportation Co. and that the parties are in a position to immediately consummate the authorized transfer.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraph 5 of Decision No. 64905 is hereby modified to read as follows:

"5. Security Transportation Co. shall amend or reissue the tariffs on file with the Commission, naming rates, rules and regulations governing the common carrier operations herein to show that it has adopted or established as its own, said rates, rules and regulations. The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days'

notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the consummation of the transfer herein authorized. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 80-A."

In all other respects Decision No. 64905 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
