Investigation on the Commission's own motion into the matter of a proposed sale and transfer by DYKE WATER COMPANY, a corporation, of a portion of its property to the City of Anaheim.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER APPROVING
ADDITION TO ESCROW INSTRUCTIONS.

In Decision No. 65860, issued August 6, 1963, the Commission approved the sale or transfer of certain properties by Dyke Water Company to the City of Anaheim on certain conditions. On August 27, 1963, the Commission by supplemental order approved specified escrow instructions for such transfer. The instructions provide that they may not be changed without Commission consent. On September 18, 1963, the Commission by supplemental order approved certain corrections of the escrow instructions.

The escrow holder, Title Insurance and Trust Company, now requests approval of two additions to said instructions authorizing the following disbursements:

(1) To City of Anaheim, the sum of \$12,355.23 representing customers' deposits with Dyke Water Company, the city to assume responsibility to the customers for such deposits.

(2) To Orange County Water District, water replenishment assessment for period from July 1, 1963, to September 1, 1963, in the total amount of \$20,333.50.

Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that the Commission consents to the following additions to the escrow instructions:

(1) The escrow holder is to disburse the sum of \$12,355.23 to the City of Anaheim; the city is to assume responsibility to the customers of Dyke Water Company for the deposits represented by said sum.

(2) The escrow holder is to disburse the sum of \$20,333.50 to Orange County Water District in payment of water replenishment assessment for July 1, 1963 to September 1, 1963.

The Secretary is directed to deliver to the Santa Ana office of Title Insurance and Trust Company a certified copy of this order.
