ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By preliminary Decision No. 66299 (November 12, 1963) three of the five causes of action, as well as the requests for relief other than the first three numbered requests, were stricken from the complaint, and defendant was directed to answer the first two causes of action. The relief sought thereby was an order requiring defendant to reestablish service without any special deposit, to credit complainant's regular bill with \$50.00, and to cancel claimed toll charges.

Defendant's counsel has advised that defendant has reinstalled service without any special deposit, intends to credit complainant with the sum of \$50.00, and that defendant was unsuccessful in a Small Claims Court action to recover toll charges from complainant.

It appearing that the relief sought by the complaint has been obtained, and that the complaint has been satisfied, IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 7738 is hereby dismissed.
