O P I N I O N

In this application Greyhound Lines, Inc., requests this Commission to accept the order of the Interstate Commerce Commission dated November 15, 1963, in its Docket No. MC-1501, thereby exempting applicant from being required to furnish the policy or certificate of insurance or bond required by our General Orders Nos. 101-A and 115.

We have considered this matter and find that Greyhound Lines, Inc., has qualified as a self-insurer with the Interstate Commerce Commission and that, during such time as said order of the Interstate Commerce Commission shall remain in effect, applicant shall be qualified as a self-insurer pursuant to General Orders Nos. 101-A and 115 with respect to its operations both as a passenger stage corporation and a charter-party carrier of passengers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission, without affecting the stability and permanency of its businesses. Based upon these findings, we conclude that the application should be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.





O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. During such time as the order of the Interstate Commerce Commission dated November 15, 1963, in its Docket No. MC-1501 shall remain in effect, Greyhound Lines, Inc., is hereby qualified as a self-insurer exempt from the requirements of General Orders Nos. 101-A and 115 providing for the furnishing of a policy or certificate of insurance or bond.

2. This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
