Defendant.ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

WILLIAM WALLACE DAVIS, a resident of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, who maintains a business known as the Half-Way Social Club, located at 10710 East Whittier Boulevard, Whittier, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that complainant was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant under numbers 692-3138 and 699-9207; that on or about July 29, 1963, the telephone facilities of complainant were disconnected by the defendant pursuant to instructions of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office to the defendant herein; that complainant has not used and does not intend to use said telephone facilities as instrumentalities to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation; that complainant has demanded of said defendant to have said telephone facilities restored but defendant has refused and does now still refuse to restore service under the telephone numbers hereinbefore set forth; that complainant has suffered and will continue to suffer great and irreparable hardship if deprived of said telephone facilities; that complainant is the sole owner of the Half-Way Social Club and the customers need the telephone facilities; that complainant cannot order supplies

for his place of business; that the telephone facilities prior to the termination thereof have been used on the premises for lawful purposes for more than seven years; that complainant seeks restoration of service forthwith; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the General Telephone Company of California, a corporation, is hereby directed to reconnect and restore telephone service to complainant and to maintain such service pending further Commission order herein, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon the General Telephone Company of California, a corporation, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply within ten (10) days after said service.
2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
