OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, C. R. Nickerson, Agent, on behalf of Willig Freight Lines (Willig), seeks authority to publish a charge of 16 cents per 100 pounds, minimum charge 75 cents, for delivery service on shipments when delivery has been attempted by carrier and not accomplished through no fault of the carrier.¹

According to the application, the proposed charge already applies via competing carriers and via Willig and connecting

¹ The proposed charge would apply under the following circumstances:
(1) When delivery has been attempted by carrier and not accomplished through no fault of the carrier.
(2) When shipment has been held at destination pursuant to instructions to the carrier by the consignor, consignee, or owner.
(3) When carrier is unable to locate consignee at the address given by the consignor, or when no delivery address is provided by the consignor and consignee's location is not known to the carrier's agent at destination.
(4) When shipments are delivered to public warehouses for storage at carrier's option after the expiration of the free time period.

Lines, is hereby authorized to establish charges for shipments requiring subsequent delivery as proposed in the above-numbered application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date hereof on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and the public.

3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within 120 days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
