## OPINION AND ORDER

By this petition, Universal Manufacturing Corporation seeks the establishment in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B of a third class less-truckload exception rating on "Ballasts, Fluorescent Lamp, not enclosed in lamp channels or chassis in boxes."

Petitioner points out that a rating as herein proposed was established recently at its request in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 and Minimum Rate Twriff No. 5 (Decisions Nos. 65312 and 65313 dated May 1, 1963, in Cases Nos. 5432 and 5435, respectively).

Petitioner states that it inadvertently omitted reference in its carlier petitions to City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B. According to the present petition, the same commodity is being shipped under these tariffs and the cost, densities and transportation characteristics are the same as shown in the prior proceedings.

A copy of the petition was mailed to the California Trucking Association on or about December 3, 1963. No objection to its being granted has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the exception rating sought by petitioner for incorporation in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B is reasonable; that the proposed revisions in these tariffs have been shown to be justified and reasonable; and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory. A public hearing is not necessary. The petition will be granted.

The order herein will provide for the establishment of the exception rating in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B. In order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A will be amended by a separate order.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (Appendix B of Decision No. 65834, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective April 4, 1964, Second Revised Page 3 and Second Revised Page 30, which revised pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

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- 3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rating authorized hereinabove, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 4. In all other respects said Decision No. 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
