Case No. 5435 (Petition for Modification No. 53)

OPINION AND ORDER

Union Carbide Corporation requests the establishment in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 of an exception rating of fourth class, less truckload, applicable to dry cell batteries.

Prior to December 28, 1963, when Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 became effective, the rating of fourth class, less carload, was applicable to the transportation of dry cell batteries within the Los Angeles Drayage Area. Said rating was prescribed in Pacific Southcoast Freight Bureau Exception No. 1-S which then governed the rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5. The fourth class rating on dry cell batteries was not brought forward into Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 which now governs said minimum rates.

We have examined Decision No. 66195 and the record in Case No. 5432, Petition No. 295 (which includes Case No. 5435, Order Setting Mearing dated November 27, 1962), to determine the reason why the exception rating of fourth class on dry cell batteries was not included in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1. The Commission's Transportation Division proposed that the rating be included (Exhibit No. 295-1, page A-16, Item 105). California Trucking Association suggested that the proposed rating not be

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included because, "Same description and rating provided for in Item 305 of MRT No. 2".

In Decision No. 66195 the Commission stated,

"Although the California Trucking Association proposes in its petitions to cancel all references to Exception Sheet No. 1-S, its research director introduced an exhibit and testified that the association concurred in the staff proposal, except that petitioner proposes cancellation of a number of exception ratings. Most of those proposed to be canceled, according to the witness, are commodities for which he could find little or no movement, or duplicated ratings in the classification or the minimum rate tariffs. A few of those proposed to be canceled have ratings which he said were unrealistic or too low. However, the witness did not present any evidence to show that these ratings were unreasonable. It appears, and we find that those ratings for which petitioner found little or no movement, or duplicate other provisions, should be canceled, but that the others should not be canceled."

The petition herein asserts that there is a movement of dry cell batteries within the Los Angeles Drayage Area. It is apparent and we find that the increase in rating resulting from the failure to include the fourth class rating in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 or Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 was an oversight. We conclude that said rating should be re-established without delay.

The maintenance of the same exception rating in both Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 5 is contrary to the purpose of the establishment of Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1. We conclude, therefore, that the fourth class rating on dry cell batteries should be prescribed in Exception Ratings Tariff

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No. 1 and that concurrently said rating should be deleted from Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 by separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 (Appendix A of Decision No. 66195, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective April 11, 1964, Second Revised Page 3 and Second Revised Page 9, which pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than ninety days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
