ORDER DENYING STAY OF ORDER
DENYING REHEARING

Petition for a rehearing of Decision No. 65919 was denied on February 25, 1964. (Decision No. 66880.) On March 6, 1964 petitioners filed a "Petition for order staying order denying rehearing", requesting that the "effective date" of the order denying rehearing be "stayed" until April 20, 1964. The effect of such an order would be to extend the statutory time within which a petition for writ of review could be filed from March 26, 1964 to April 20, 1964.

Public Utilities Code section 1756 provides in part as follows:

"1756. Within 30 days after the application for a rehearing is denied, or, if the application is granted, then within 30 days after the decision on rehearing, the applicant may apply to the Supreme Court of this State for a writ of certiorari or review for the purpose of having the lawfulness of the original order or decision or of the order or decision on rehearing inquired into and determined. * * *"

The Commission is without jurisdiction to extend the statutory time for the filing of a petition for a writ of review, and IT IS ORDERED that the petition for an order staying the order denying rehearing is hereby denied.
