ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Complainants request that defendant be temporarily restrained from printing and distributing the central section of the Los Angeles telephone directory in an all-numeral form and that defendant be ordered to print and distribute said directory with the names of the prefixes heretofore assigned to the respective subscribers until such time as a final determination in Cases Nos. 7445 and 7449 can be had. Defendant's answer, requesting that the complaint be dismissed, was filed on July 29, 1963.

A temporary restraining order against The Pacific 2/Telephone and Telegraph Company was issued in Case No. 7504 on September 30, 1963. It applied to the statewide operations of Pacific Telephone.
