ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Complainants' request an order of the Commission directing defendant to cease and desist from imposing all-number calling upon complainants, or upon persons similarly situated, especially as it pertains to advertisement; enjoining defendant from eliminating all-name prefix telephone service and compelling defendant to restore all-name prefix telephone service which has been discontinued; and restraining defendant, pending hearing and order on the complaint, from converting to all-number calling as it pertains principally to advertising.

The issues raised in this complaint are essentially the same as those presented in Cases Nos. 7445, 7449 and 7504. Final decision in said proceedings having been issued, we find that the complaint in Case No. 7786 should be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that the complaint in Case No. 7786 be and the same hereby is dismissed.
