OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 66451 of December 10, 1963, added certain items to Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 effective January 11, 1964, upon petition of California Trucking Association. ¹ The Commission now is informed that the petition and resulting decision omitted inadvertently from added Item No. 170 the letters "SU" (meaning "set up") as part of the commodity description. ² The omission has caused questions to arise concerning the application of the item.

The letters "SU" will be added to the commodity description to avoid any misinterpretation of Item No. 170. The Commission is informed that the interested shippers and California Trucking Association are in agreement concerning the desirability and necessity of such amendment. A public hearing is not necessary.

¹ Decision No. 66451 was issued in Cases Nos. 5432 and 5435 (Petitions for Modification Nos. 314 and 52, respectively). The instant Case No. 7858 was instituted on March 10, 1964, as the proceeding for consideration of revisions in Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1.

² The item relates to boxes, bottles, or cans, fibreboard, paper or pulpboard.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exception Ratings Tariff No. 1 (Appendix A to Decision No. 66195, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective April 25, 1964, Third Revised Page 9 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public and shall be made effective not later than April 25, 1964.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the exception ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the exception ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing the long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects said Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
