SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

A report of the Commission's Transportation Division Rate Branch staff was sent to interested parties on May 29, 1963, for study and comment. The report recommended certain changes in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7. The transmittal letter informed the parties that, in the absence of objection or request for public hearing, consideration may be given to the issuance of an ex parte order revising the tariff in accordance with the staff recommendation.

The staff report recommends that certain distance and hourly rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 be made applicable to the transportation in dump trucks of certain perlite rock, soapstone, talc, pyrophyllite, gypsum rock, and expanded perlite and shale. The report describes the commodities and their transportation characteristics, and likens these commodities to others currently subject to the provisions of that tariff.

Written comments have been received from California Trucking Association and Ridgelite Products. The latter objected to ex parte consideration pending clarification of certain items

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in the staff report. By letter from the Secretary of the Commission, dated July 8, 1963, clarification was made to Ridgelite Products and the objection was subsequently withdrawn. No other objection to the staff recommendations has been received. California Trucking Association suggested that the commodity descriptions be couched in broader terms than proposed by the staff, but supported the staff effort to clarify the tariff.

The staff report is received in evidence as Ex Parte Exhibit No. H-1 in Case No. 5437; the written comments thereon and correspondence incidental thereto are received in evidence collectively as Ex Parte Exhibit No. H-2.

From the exhibits of record it appears that the tariff revisions recommended by the staff are appropriate and desirable. The broader commodity descriptions suggested by California Trucking Association would introduce inconsistencies with the descriptions in other items of the same tariff, and therefore will not be considered at this time. The descriptions may be reviewed when the commodity items as a whole are under consideration.

Upon consideration of the evidence in this proceeding, the Commission finds that the tariff modifications proposed by the staff are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 will be amended accordingly by the order herein.

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IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 32566, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective April 25, 1964, Fourteenth Revised Page 8, Ninth Revised Page 9 and Tenth Revised Page 41, which pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. In all other respects Decision No. 32566, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
