Application of the State of California,
 Department of Public Works, for an order
 authorizing construction of four new
 crossings at separated grades whereby
 State Route III-Yolo, Sac-6-C, Sac (New
 III-Yol, Sac-80) will be carried over the
 tracks of the Sacramento-Yolo Port
 District Belt Railroad, Sacramento
 Northern Railway and Southern Pacific
 Company, in the City of Sacramento in
 Sacramento County and in Yolo County,
 referred to as "Sacramento River Viaduct".)

O R D E R

State of California, Department of Public Works, is hereby authorized to construct four crossings at separated grades of State Route 6 (New Route 80) (Sign Route U.S. 40-99W) over (1) the main line track of the Sacramento-Yolo Port District Belt Railroad and the tracks of the Sacramento Northern Railway, (2) the spur tracks of the Sacramento Northern Railway, (3) the Sacramento Terminal Branch Line track of Sacramento Northern Railway and (4) the Walnut Grove Branch Line tracks of Southern Pacific Company, in the County of Yolo and City of Sacramento at the locations described in Exhibits "A" and "B" of the above-numbered application and substantially as set forth in the application, to be designated as Crossings Nos. S-91.7-A, S-93.1-AC, SH-4.95-A and AU-90.1-A, respectively.

Expense of construction and maintenance of the work herein authorized shall be borne in accordance with agreements to be entered into between the parties involved, and a copy of said agreements

together with plans of the construction authorized herein and approved by the affected railroads, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion such costs by subsequent order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
