Western Gillette, Inc. ${ }^{\text {I/ }}$ requests that its operating authority as a highway comon carrier be restated.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Daly at Los Angeles on March 18, 1964, and the matter was submitted. No appearance was made in protest to the authority sought.

Applicant presently operates wichin the state pursuant to prescriptive authority predicated upon operations actually conducted on July 26, 1917, and certificates of public convenlence and necessity subsequently issued. The requested restatement of service is substantially the same as that presently provided. Some minox changes are proposed which would result both in restrictions and in Iimited extensions of service.

It is alleged that a mumer of certificates are stated in terms that make it difficult to fix with certainty the exact

[^0]description of the limitations designated in the original orders. It is further alleged that in order for the restated certificate to be meaningful it is necessaxy for applicant to adopt a consistent plan of comodity description and consolidated territorial descriptions into service areas which have some geographic and economic unity and as a result the proposed service under the restated certificate produces both abandonments and extensions of sezvice of a limited character.

After consideration the Comission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought.
OREER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Western Gillette, Inc. authorizing it to operate as a highway comon carriex, as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points set forth in Appendices A, B, C, $D, E, F ; G, H, I$ and $J$ attached hereto and made a part hereof.
2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant sball comply with and observe the following sexvice regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that it will be required, among other things, to file ammai reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules of the califormia Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Comilssion's General Order No. 99 and insurance requerements of the Commission's General Order No. 100-B. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Coumission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Orders Nos. 99
and $100-B$, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days' notice to the Comission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
(d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. $80-\mathrm{A}$.
3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order supersedes all existing certificates of public convenience and necessity authorizing the transportation of general commodities heretofore granted to or acquired by Western Gillette, Inc. and presently possessed by it, which certificates, together with all prescriptive rights, are hereby revoked, said revocation to become effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 2(b) hereof.
4. The authority revoked by paragraph 3 of this order includes all prescriptive rights and the rights granted by Decisions Nos. 24066, 26995, 27766, 32980, 33073, 32875, 33820, 32245, 35652, 37110, 38050, 43003, 47901, 48698, 51286, 55398, 60845, 63716.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Latexal and radial miles referred to in the appendices are statute miles of 5,280 feet eack, measured in a straight line without regard to terrain features.

Applicant is authorized to operate over any and all available routes between and within said above designated areas and places. In connection with the services authorized in Paragraphs A and B above, applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements as set forth in Pazagraph (d) of Item 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sows, steers, stags, or swine.
3. Liquids, compressed gases, comodities in semiplastic form and comodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tanic semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
4. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
5. Comodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
