In the Matter of the Application of Southern Pacific Company for an order authorizing construction at grade of its relocated main line track across proposed relocated Siskiyou County Road, known as Mott Road No. 2M025, at railroad station of Pioneer, County of Siskiyou, State of California.	}	Application No. 46593
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O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to relocate its Shasta Route main line track at grade across relocated Mott Road No. 2M025. a county road, near Pioneer, Siskiyou County. at the location described in the application, the relocated crossing to be identified as Crossing No. C-334.9. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the road now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding four percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission.

Upon completion of Crossing No. C-334.9, existing Crossing No. C-334.8. about 200 feet southerly, shall be abandoned and closed by Southern Pacific Company.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order. applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with.

Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant desires to begin construction as soon as possible and has requested immediate authorization. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
