#### OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common carrier, highway contract carrier and city carrier permits and a certificate to operate as a highway common carrier.<sup>1</sup> By Decision No. 65694, dated July 9, 1963, in Application No. 45362, it was authorized to assess rates less than the applicable minimum rates for shipments of frozen cakes, pies, cookie rolls and dough for the Carnation Company from Los Angeles Territory to San Francisco Territory, Fresno, Sacramento, Chico and certain intermediate points, and fresh frozen fruits and berries from certain of the aforenamed places and Watsonville to Los Angeles Territory. This authority is scheduled to expire with July 30, 1964. By this application, authority is sought to continue to charge less than the minimum rates otherwise applicable for a further one-year period.

Applicant states that there has continued to be a substantial movement of the traffic embraced herein and that the shipper has informed applicant that it will continue to use the service offered by applicant in substantially the same manner and extent as it has in the past if the sought rate relief is granted. Applicant's highway common carrier certificate does not apply to the transportation of the commodities involved herein.

to the application is a profit and loss statement for the year 1963 which indicates that the operations involved herein have been conducted at a profit. Applicant asserts that it has, in common with other members of the trucking industry, experienced certain increases in the cost of performing its services in general. However, applicant believes that even with these increases it will still be able to conduct a profitable operation for the year 1964. Applicant therefore proposes to continue to assess the rates currently authorized.

According to the application, Carnation Company continues to own and operate a substantial fleet of motor truck equipment for transporting certain of its products and is capable of using its own vehicles for the movement of traffic involved herein in the event the sought authority is not granted.

The certificate of service states that a copy of the application was mailed to the shipper and California Trucking Association on March 15, 1964. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates as more specifically set forth in Appendix A hereof are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Gould Transportation Co., Inc., operating as a highway permit carrier, is hereby authorized to transport frozen cakes, frozen pics, frozen cookie rolls and frozen dough, in straight or mixed shipments, and frosh frozen fruits and fresh frozen berries for the Carnation Company at rates less than the established minimum rates, but not less than those set forth in and subject to the provisions shown in Appendix A attached herete and by this reference made a part hereof.

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2. The authority granted herein shall, on and after July 30, 1964, supercede the authority granted by Decision No. 65694 and shall expire with July 30, 1965.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

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APPENDIX A TO DECISION NO. <u>67329</u>

(Rates are stated in cents per 100 pounds)

1. Fruit pies, frozon, as described in Item No. 40580, Meat pies, frozen, as described in Item No. 40570, Dough, frozen, as described in Item No. 39780, and cream pies, cakes, cockie rolls, frozen, as described in Item No. 39990 of Western Classification No. 77, J.P. Hackler, Tariff Publishing Officer, in straight or mixed shipments, minimum weight 36,000 pounds.

From Los Angeles Territory, as defined in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, <u>to</u>: <u>Rate</u>

- (a) Fresho and intermediate points on U.S. Highway 99 47
- (b) San Francisco Territory, as defined in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2, and intermediate points between Fresno and San Francisco on U.S. Highways 99 and 50, and State Highway 33, and intermediate points between Gilroy and San Francisco on U.S. Highway 101
- (c) Sacramento and intermediate points between Fresno and Sacramento on U.S. Highway 99 and State Highway 33 61

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- (d) Chico and intermediate points between Sacramonto and Chico on U.S. Highways 40, 99-E and 40 Alternate 78
- 2. Fresh Frozen Fruit and Fresh Frozen Berries, minimum weight 38,000 pounds.

To Los Angeles Territory, from:

- (a) Fresno and points and places within 25 miles thereof, except points on U.S. Highway 99 north of Fresno, and intermediate points between Fresno and Bakersfield, on U.S. Highway 99
- (b) San Francisco Territory, and intermediate points on
  U.S. Highway 99 and State Highway 33 north of Fresno,
  on U.S. Highway 101 between San Francisco and Gilroy,
  and off-route points within 10 miles of Watsonville
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- (c) Sacramento and intermediate points between Sacramento and Fresno on U.S. Highway 99 and State Highway 33 61
- (d) Chico and intermediate points between Chico and Sacramento on U.S. Highways 40, 99-E and 40 Alternate 78

NOTES:

1. All of the foregoing rates are intended to include refrigeration service without additional charge.

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- 2. All of the foregoing rates are intended to include an allowance for loading at points of origin of one man for 4 hours per shipment of 36,000 pounds or more. When additional loading time is required, additional charges on the basis of those provided in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 will be assessed.
- 3. All of the foregoing rates are intended to include split pickup or split delivery service, subject to the additional split pickup or split delivery charges provided in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2.
- 4. No shipment of fresh frozen fruits or of fresh frozen berries, transported under any of the rates authorized herein, shall be accorded split pickup service both at a point or points specified in Note A and at a point or points specified in Note B, below,
- 5. No shipment of frozen pies, frozen cakes, frozen dough, or frozen cookie rolls transported under any of the rates authorized herein shall be accorded split delivery service both at a point or points specified in Note A and at a point or points specified in Note B, below.

Note A

San Francisco Territory, as defined in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2; points on U.S. Highway 101, Gilroy to, but not including, said San Francisco Territory; points within 10 miles of Watsonville.

Note B

Points on U.S. Highway 99 north of State Highway 152; points on State Highway 33 north of State Highway 152.

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
