OPINION AND ORDER

Senna Trucking Co. Inc., presently operating as a highway

Applicant was authorized by Decision No. 58659, dated June 23, 1959, in Application No. 36216, to transport the following commodities between the San Francisco Territory and the Los Angeles Territory:

common carrier for limited commodities, requests authority to sus-

pend operations for one year.

Boilers, Furnaces, Radiators, Stoves, Related Articles or Parts Names, as described in Items Nos. 11960 to 13280. (See Note.)

Iron or Steel, as described in Items Nos. 53610 to 55290. (See Note.)

Conduits, Pipe, Smokestacks, Tubing or Fittings, other than Clay, Concrete or Earthcrn, as described in Items Nos. 29220 to 30440. (See Note.)

Miscellaneous Commodities, viz.:
Rubber, reclaimed
Rubber, crude
Scrap metal.

NOTE: The term "Items" as used above means the Items so designated in Western Classification No. 77, J. P. Hackler, Tariff Publishing Officer, on the issue date thereof.

Applicant alleges that shippers of iron or steel items are also shippers of aluminum, brass, bronze and copper items; that applicant is unable to combine said shipments either as a highway common carrier or a permitted carrier and hence is unable to give

the service required by the public; that applicant is willing to provide the service required and for that purpose is preparing an application to your Commission to enlarge the commodities authorized to be transported as a highway common carrier; that pending said application applicant requests this suspension so that it may operate as a permitted carrier only.

After consideration the Commission finds that applicant has dedicated its service to the public as a highway common carrier and its obligation to serve may not be suspended for operating convenience only. The application will be denied. A public hearing is not necessary.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 45354 is hereby denied.
