ORDER DENYING PETITION TO SET ASIDE SUBMISSION AND REOPEN THE PROCEEDING

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, on June 9, 1964, filed a petition to set aside submission and reopen the above-entitled proceeding for the taking of additional evidence. The Commission's order issued concurrently today in Case No. 7409 contemplates further hearings in the proceeding on final rate spread and other pertinent matters. The petition presents no facts or claims that have not heretofore been considered or that cannot be considered if relevant in the further hearings contemplated in this proceeding.

We find that respondent's petition should be denied.

IT IS ORDERED that the petition filed on June 9, 1964, by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to set aside submission and reopen the proceeding in Case No. 7409 is denied.
