O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct a spur track under State Route 2 (Ventura Freeway), and at grade across the Freeway Off Ramp and West Main Street (On Ramp), near Ventura in the County of Ventura, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as Crossings Nos. E-396.4-AC and E-396.5-C, respectively.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense.

Construction of the crossing at grade shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without super-elevation and 60 feet in width, in accordance with plan attached to the application, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one percent. Protection at the West Main Street (On Ramp) portion of the crossing shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75B) with backlights. Protection at the Off Ramp portion of the crossing shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75B) without backlights.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
