O R D E R

The City of Tustin is hereby authorized to construct Holt Avenue at grade across the Tustin Branch of the Southern Pacific Company at the location as described and in the manner as shown in the application, as amended May 15, 1964, to be identified as Crossing No. BM-521.78 in the City of Tustin, Orange County.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines.

Width of the crossing shall be 80 feet in accordance with plan attached to the application, and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by three Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B), with additional flashing lights on signal in the southeast quadrant for left turn movements from Newport Avenue.

Upon completion of Crossing No. BM-521.78, and its being open to public travel, the existing crossing of Holt Avenue (Crossing No. BM-521.8) shall be physically abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if the above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
