

ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

MILTON SMITH, of 1541 W. 68th Street, Los Angeles, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that prior to May 21, 1964, complainant was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant under number PL 1-7613, located at 1541 W. 68th Street, Los Angeles; that on or about May 21, 1964, the telephone facilities of complainant were removed and disconnected by the defendant pursuant to instructions from the Los Angeles City Police, purporting to be based upon probable cause for the belief that said telephone facilities were being used for unlawful purposes; that complainant has not used and does not intend to use said telephone facilities as instrumentalities to violate the law nor in aiding or abetting such violation; that complainant has made demand upon defendant to have the said telephone facilities restored but defendant has refused and does now still refuse to do so; that complainant has suffered and will continue to suffer great hardship if deprived of said telephone facilities; that complainant seeks restoration of telephone facilities forthwith; and good cause appearing,
