ORDER CANCELLING GENERAL ORDER NO. 99

By Decision No. 46089 dated August 14, 1951, in this proceeding, the Commission adopted General Order No. 99 entitled "Safety Rules and Other Regulations Governing the Operation of Highway Common Carriers, Petroleum Irregular Route Carriers, and Petroleum Contract Carriers". These rules became effective January 1, 1952 and were amended from time to time as changing conditions required.

The 1963 Legislature by Statutes 1963, Chapter 2148, amended Section 768 of the Public Utilities Code and Section 3546 of the Highway Carriers' Act so as to eliminate the Commission's authority to regulate the safety of operations of highway common carriers, petroleum irregular route carriers and petroleum contract carriers. Such authority was transferred to the California Highway Patrol.

IT IS ORDERED that General Order No. 99 adopted by Decision No. 46089 and all subsequent amendments is hereby cancelled.
