Certified Freight Lines, Inc., presently engaged as a highway common carrier for the transportation of fruits and vegetables, requests that its operating authority be amended by excluding therefrom the right to transport fresh fruits and vegetables moving to canneries.

It is alleged that the transportation involved is exempt under Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 and that applicant could better serve its agricultural customers under its permitted authority.

After consideration the Commission finds that the requested authority would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Certified Freight Lines, Inc., may discontinue transporting as a highway common carrier fruits and vegetables, fresh or green, in their natural form (not cold pack or frozen), when moving to canneries. A. 46849 ied

2. Appendix B of Decision No. 62940 is hereby amended by incorporating First Revised Page 1 attached hereto in place of Original Page 1.

3. After the effective date hereof and on not less than 2days' notice to the Commission and to the public applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

CERTIFIED FREIGHT LINES, INC. First Revised Page 1 (a corporation) Cancels Original Page 1

Certified Freight Lines, Inc., a corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport fresh or green fruits and vegetables, in their natural form (except cold pack or frozen or when moving to canneries), including fresh mushrooms (not cold pack or frozen), and empty carriers returning, as follows:

- 1. Between points in the San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix C attached hereto, on the one hand, and points in the Los Angeles Territory as described in Appendix F attached hereto, on the other hand. Applicant shall not transport any shipments having both points of origin and destination within the San Francisco Territory or within the Los Angeles Territory. No service is authorized to or from intermediate points except as hereinafter authorized.
- 2. Between points on the following named highways:
 - a. U.S. Highway 101 between Paso Robles and Thousand Oaks, inclusive, including the offroute points of Camp Roberts, Avila, Garey, Sisquot and Los Olivos.
 - b. State Highway 41 between Paso Robles and Cambria, inclusive.
 - c. State Highway 1 between Cambria and Las Cruces, inclusive, including the off-route points of Camp San Luis Obispo, Vandenberg Air Force Base (formerly Camp Cooke), Betteravia and Casmalia.
 - d. State Highway 166 between Guadalupe and Santa Maria, inclusive.
 - e. Unnumbered county road known as Orcutt Road between Santa Maria and Orcutt, inclusive.
