ORDER DISCONTINUING CASE NO. 7366

On May 28, 1962 the Commission instituted an investigation on its own motion to determine whether or not public safety and health required the installation and maintenance of additional or improved protection where Lenzen and Cinnabar Streets cross the rails of the Southern Pacific Company in the City of San Jose. The matter was scheduled for hearing and then removed from the calendar after the respondent agreed that automatic gates would be installed.

The installation was completed on June 15, 1964 and the gates are now in operation.

We hereby find that Case No. 7366 has accomplished its purpose and we conclude that the case should be discontinued.

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 7366 is discontinued.
