O R D E R

The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company is hereby authorized to construct a spur track across Eighth Street and Twentieth Street, near Cucamonga, San Bernardino County, at the locations described in the application and as shown on the map attached thereto.

The spur track crossing at Eighth Street shall be identified as Crossing No. 2-96.8-C. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72 without superelevation and of a width of 24 feet, with tops of rails flush with existing roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding two percent in accordance with plan attached to the application. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) with reflex reflecting sheet material. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Twentieth Street is not improved at the location of the proposed construction, and this authority shall not be construed as authorizing the opening of said street across said track.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
