Application of the State of California,
Department of Public Works, for an order
authorizing construction of a crossing
at separated grades whereby State Route
VII-SBd-40 will be carried over the
tracks of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa
Fe Railway Company in San Bernardino
County, referred to as "Park Moabi
Overhead".

O R D E R

State of California, Department of Public Works, in connection with the improvement of State Route 40, is hereby authorized to construct one crossing at separated grades, over The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company's main line, to be identified as the Park Moabi Overhead (Crossing No. 2-567.3-A), in San Bernardino County, at the location described and in the manner as shown in the application.

Clearances shall be in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 26-D, except that vertical clearances shall be not less than 24'2" in accordance with plan attached to the application.

Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans approved by The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencement of construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs by further order.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
