O P I N I O N

Weisz Trucking Co., Inc., a corporation (applicant), requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a cement carrier in Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange and Riverside Counties.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Rogers on August 12 and 13, 1964, at Los Angeles, and the matter was submitted.

Applicant is a California corporation and its articles of incorporation are on file with this Commission. It has continuously transported cement pursuant to a radial highway common

carrier permit since 1960 and has been transporting aggregate since 1953. Since 1960 it has provided transportation services for various cement producers, including California Portland Cement, Riverside Cement Company, Southwest Portland Cement Company, and Kaiser Cement and Gypsum Corp. between points in Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange and Riverside Counties. It owns and operates seven trains, each of which includes a tractor and two cement hopper trailers. As of July 31, 1964, it had a net worth of \$48,474. There were no appearances in protest to the granting of the application.

After consideration, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity requires the granting of the application. The Commission further finds that the authority granted should be effective on the date hereof.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity be and is granted to WEISZ TRUCKING CO., INC., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a cement carrier as defined in Section 214.1 of the Public Utilities Code, as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto.
2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
 - a. Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of

public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 100 series. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 100 series may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- b. On or before October 1, 1964, applicant shall file tariffs in triplicate in the Commission's office, said tariffs to comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in General Order No. 117, and to be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of the authority herein granted on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
