## OPINION AND ORDER

By Petition for Modification No. 46 in Case No. 5438,
California Trucking Association requests revision of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 to provide for the use of Distance Table No. 5 in determining distance rates. Petitioner asks that all comon carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the comission's order in this proceeding, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

Minimu Rate Tariff No. 8 provides rates for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegenaloles and related items. Distance rates in this tariff are governed by distances established in Dism tonce Table No. 4. Petitioner's proposal herein is that the rates be governed instead by Distance Table No. 5.

Petitioner states that Distance Table No. 5 is now and more realistic than Distance Table No. 4. Petitioner further states that the proposal herein has been made known to shippers and carriers of fresh fxuits and vegetables and their representatives. It js asserted that the requested change is generally desired by such parties and will be in their best interest. Ex parte action is requested.

Copies of the verified petition were mailed to various intercested parties on or about August 13, 1964. By ietter dated August 14, 1964, California Farm Bureau Federation informed the Commission that it is in full accore with petitioner's proposal. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

Distance Table NO. 5 was printed for service with, and by reference made a part of, Decision No. 66578 dated January 7, 1964, in Case No. 7024. It has been served upon all respondent earriers and appearances. Ordering paragraph 2 of the decision states:

> "Distance Table No. 5 shall be effective February $i$, 1964, but shali not be applicable to any minimum sate toriff until so ordered. in a minimum rate proceeding pertaining to that minimu rate tariff."

The Comission has made Distonce Table No. 5 applicable to Minimun Rate Tariff No. 2 (general comodities) ${ }^{1}$; Minimun Rate Tariff No. 3-A (Iivestock) ${ }^{2}$; Minimum Rate Tariff No. 10 (cement and related

3 , 4 comodities) : Minimum Rate Tariff No. 11-A (uncrated new furmiture): Minimum Rate Tariff No. 12 (motor vehicles and related items) ${ }^{5}$ and Minimu Rate Tariff No. 14 (hay and related commodities) ${ }^{6}$ upon consideration of the instant petition, it appears, and the Comission finds, that (1) the constructive mileages set forth in Distance Table No. 5, when applied in conjunction with Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8, will result in just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for transportation governed by the tariff; (2) the provisions of Distance rable No. 5 are, and will bo, reasonable provisions for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables and related items by comon corriers as defined in the Public Utilities Act; and $I$

(3) rules, regulations and distances which are maintained by the comon carriers for transportntion involved hemein within California are, and for the future will be, uneasondule, insufeicient and not justified by the actual competitive sates of competing corriers or by the cost of other means of transportation insofor as they are lower in volume or effect than those set forth in Distance Table No. 5. An public hearing is not necessary. The petition will be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimun Rate Tariff No. 8 (Appendix C of Decision No. 33977, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective November 1,1964 , the revised pases attached hexeto and listed in Appondix A also attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
2. The basis for constructively increasing highway mineages prescribed by the Comission in Decision No. 66578 eated January 7, 1964, in Case No. 7024, is hereby adopted, established anc approved as the just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory basis for compating distances for use in applying distance rates in vinimum Rate Mariff No. 8 as hereinafter provided.
3. The rates and charges set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 detemmined under the provisions of Distance rable No. 5 and the rules and regulations governing such rates and charges are hereby established as the minimum reasonable and sufficient rates and charges to be published, assessed, charged, collected and oloserved by all comon carriers as defined in the Pubic Utilities fet for the transportation of frosh fruits and•vegetables and related jtems betweon the points for which rates are provided in the tariff.

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4. Common carriers are hereby authorized to adope Distance rable NO. 5 as the basis for computing distances for use in applying distance rates in their comon exrier taxifis for the transportation of:
(a) commodities for which minimum rates have not been estalished, or
(b) commodities which are subject to higher rates than, or more restrictive provisions than, the minimum rates or provisions otherwise applicable.
5. Common carriers need not file with this Commission a distance table for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetablos and related items but may instead puolish in their tariffs the folIowing provision to be made applicable only to distance rates for the transportation of saic comodities:

> "Distances to be used in connection with distance rates mamed herein shall be determined in accord ance with Distance Table No. 5 issued by the public Utilities Commission of the State of California."
6. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers $2 s$ a result of the order herein may be made effective not earliex than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than November 1, 1964; and the tariff publications which are authorized but not reouired to be made by comon carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not cariier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days" notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective dote of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

7. Common carriers are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintaine under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizetions are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order: and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing longand short-haul departures and to this order.
8. In all other respects said Decision No. 33977, as amended. shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

(e) CONTAINER ICING means placing ice within the package with tine iruit or vegotable shipped.
$\phi(t)$ DISTANCE TABLE means Distance Tabio No. 5.
(g) DEBTOR means the person obilgated to pay the froight charges to the carrier, whether consignor, comsignoo, or other party.
(h) ESTABLISEED DEPOT moans a Iroight terminal ownec or leased and maintainod by a carmer for the recelpt and delivery of shipmentis.
(1) INDEPENDENT-CONTRACTOR SUBEATUER Means any carrier who renders service for a primeipal carrier, for a specinied recompense, for a specified resuit, under the control of tho principal as to the recult of the work only and not as to the means by which such result is accomplished.
(9) PICKOP AND DELIVERY CHARGE meane the ful. charge appifcablo without the deduction authorized by Item No. I20.
