O R D E R

City of San Jose is hereby authorized to construct Hillsdale Expressway at separated grades over the track of Southern Pacific Company, in San Jose, Santa Clara County, at the location and substantially as shown by map (Exhibit A-1) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-52.2-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Upon the completion of the overpass structure, the Hillsdale Avenue crossing, No. E-51.7, and the Hillsdale Avenue crossing, No. EX-55.6, at grade shall be abandoned and closed to public use and travel.

This project was assigned priority number four in this Commission's Decision No. 66484 in Case No. 7683 dated December 17, 1963, which established the 1964 grade separation priority list

pursuant to Section 189 of the Streets and Highways Code.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years, unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
