OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, filed July 29, 1964, amended August 5, 1964, General Telephone Company of California seeks authorization, pursuant to General Order No. 96-A, Section X, Paragraph A, to carry out the terms of an agreement with Subscription Television, Incorporated (TV Company), dated July 17, 1964, as set forth in Exhibit A to the application.

The facilities to be furnished for TV Company consist of channels for television and audio transmission in connection with a pay television distribution network and are similar to facilities which this Commission has authorized. The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to furnish to the same customer in areas adjacent to the areas served by applicant.

Applicant estimates that the cost of construction of the facilities required under the contract will be \$476,650. Investment of applicant is protected by requiring TV Company to make an advance deposit equal to the estimated construction cost. The monthly rate for the service initially to be provided amounts to \$13,150 plus 50 cents for each service drop.

- 1. General Telephone Company of California is authorized to carry out the terms of the contract attached to the application and marked Exhibit A, with Subscription Television, Incorporated, dated July 17, 1964.
- 2. After applicant has experienced a full calendar year's operation thereunder, it shall, within minety days thereafter, submit a results of operation report for such first calendar year to the Commission. Such report shall include supplemental information concerning the amount of deposit refunded, if any, detail of nonrecurring charges and the end-of-period number of drops being provided under the contract.
- 3. After applicant has had two full calendar years' operating experience under this contract, it shall submit, within ninety days thereafter, a report setting forth the advisability of providing this service on a tariff schedule basis and, if advisable, a proposed tariff in definitive form.
- 4. Applicant shall notify the Commission when operations under this authority have begun and service is being rendered to subscribers as contemplated in the contract.

5. The outhority granted herein will lapse if not exercised within two years.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
