O P I N I O N

President Tank Lines, Inc., requests that its operating authority be suspended until September 1, 1965.

Applicant is authorized to transport petroleum products in tank trucks and tank trailers as a highway common carrier. (Decision No. 42623.) It is also authorized to operate as a petroleum irregular route carrier. (Decision No. 44368.) By Decision No. 65978, as amended by Decision No. 66104, applicant was authorized to suspend operations until September 1, 1964, because it was experiencing economic difficulties. For the same reasons applicant requests that the suspension be extended for another year.

After consideration, the Commission finds that further suspension will not be adverse to the public interest; however, applicant is hereby placed upon notice that no further suspension will be granted and unless operations are resumed after September 1, 1965, the operating authority herein considered will be revoked. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The operative rights granted by the certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by President Tank Lines, Inc., by Decision No. 42623 and Decision No. 44368 are hereby suspended until September 1, 1965.

2. All effective tariff filings of such carrier filed pursuant to the certificate acquired by the decisions referred to above are hereby suspended until September 1, 1965. Suspension supplements to tariff filings so suspended are not required and shall not be filed.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
