## OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 66420 dated December 3, 1963, in Application No. 45851 and order extending expiration date dated June 3, 1964, applicant was authorized, as a highway contract carrier, to charge less than the minimum rates named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 for the transportation of trisodium phosphate from Richmond to Sacramento for the Procter & Gamble Company. The material is transported in shipper cwned bins of not less than 60 cubic feet capacity. The authority is scheduled to expire with October 3, 1964.

By this application, applicant seeks to extend the current authority. Applicant also requests that the authority be modified by providing a rating of 50 percent of the fourth class rating, subject to a minimum rate of 29 cents per 100 pounds, in lieu of stated rates in cents per 100 pounds for the transportation of the used empty bins returning for a pay load.

Applicant alleges that it is operating under full capacity load factors in hauling for the shipper from Richmond to Sacramento; and it is able to realize substantial economies in operations. Applicant avers that it has hauled all the bulk trisodium phosphate for the shipper since December, 1960, under less than minimum rate authority. Volume shipments exceed 6,000,000 (six million) pounds per year.

Applicant avers that its revenues and earnings for this transportation are profitable and that the granting of the sought authority will have no adverse effect on other modes of transportation: A cost study attached to the application indicates that the operation will be performed at a profit.

The application states that a copy thereof was served on California Trucking Association on or about August 27, 1964. No objection to its being granted has been received.

In the circumstances it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The petition will be granted. However, because the conditions involved herein may change at any time, the authority will be made to expire at the end of one year.

In view of the expiration date of the current authority, the order which follows will be made effective on October 3, 1964.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Sierra Distributing, Ltd., is hereby authorized to transport trisodium phosphate, chlorinated or not chlorinated, in bulk in containers, and used empty bins for Procter & Gamble Company at less than the established minimum rates but not less than those set forth in, and subject to the provisions shown in, Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

The authority herein granted shall expire with October
3, 1965.

The effective date of this order shall be October 3, 1964. Dated at San Francisco, California, this <u>1214</u> day of September, 1964.
