OPINION

This application requests the issuance of a radial highway common carrier permit to authorize the transportation of general commodities with certain exceptions throughout the state.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Rowe in Los Angeles on August 5, 1964. Applicant requested a continuance to an unstated time for the reason that the lawyer it wished to employ was then engaged in a court trial and because it had turned its records over to the Interstate Commerce Commission, although notified of the date of this hearing.

Continuance was denied by the examiner because, although knowing for over two weeks that it would not be in a position to put on its evidence, applicant had delayed asking for a continuance until the hearing was called. Applicant thereupon indicated that it had no evidence to produce. The matter was accordingly submitted for decision.

The examiner's ruling was proper. The examiner and other staff members had traveled from San Francisco to Los Angeles for this hearing; their time and the attendant expense to the State could have been saved if applicant had made a request for continuance within a reasonable time prior to the hearing.

There being no evidence of record before it, the Commission finds and concludes that Application No. 46672 should be dismissed without prejudice.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 46672 is dismissed without prejudice.
