 and East Railroad Avenue in the County of  
 Sacramento, State of California.

ORDER

Central California Traction Company is hereby authorized to construct a track at grade across Power Inn Road and to construct a track at grade across 20th Avenue and East Railroad Avenue in the City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, at the locations and in the manner described in the application. The crossing at Power Inn Road is to be identified as Crossing No. 61-44.6. Since the track construction across 20th Avenue and East Railroad Avenue, authorized herein, will not cross the traveled portion of the roadway, no crossing designation or protection is necessary, and this order is not to be deemed authority for such opening across the traveled portion of the roadway. Construction of Crossing No. 61-44.6 shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the road now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one percent. Protection at Crossing No. 61-44.6 shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) equipped with reflectorized "STOP ON RED SIGNAL" signs. No protection need be installed at the 20th Avenue and East Railroad Avenue location. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Upon completion of Crossing No. 61-44.6, existing grade separation trestle Crossing No. 61-44.6-B, located approximately 13 feet northerly and Crossing No. 61-44.6-C, located approximately 40 feet northerly shall be abandoned and physically removed by applicant.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
