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## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. <u>67974</u>, entered today in Case No. 5432, et al., the Commission found that "disaster supplies" should be exempted from the minimum rates.

The aforesaid decision also found that in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B should be amended by separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (Appendix B to Decision No. 65834, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective <u>November 14, 1954</u>, Fourth Revised Page 13, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

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In all other respects, said Decision No. 65834 as amended, chall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

Containers, produce, empty, as described in and for which rates are provided in Section No. 4 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8.

\*Disaster Supplies, i.e., those commodities which are allocated to provide relief during a state of extreme emergency or state of disaster; and those commodities which are transported for a civil defense or disaster organization established and functioning in accordance with the California Disaster Act to ultimate point of storage or use prior to or during a state of disaster or state of extreme emergency.

Fruits and vegetables, fresh or green (not cold pack nor frozen).

Furniture, household appliances and other home furnishings, transported from retail stores where they have been sold at retail by a retail merchant, or transported from retail customers to retail stores.

Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semi-trailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.

Motor vehicles when towed by a tow car.

Mushrooms, fresh (not cold pack nor frozen).

Nuts, in the shell.

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Nuts, field shelled (rough shelled, with or without removal of broken shells, dirt, residue, or foreign material, and not cleaned nor further processed).
