SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 67974, entered today in Case No. 5432, et al., the Commission found that "disaster supplies" should be exempted from the minimum rates.

The aforesaid decision also found that in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff No. 11-A should be amended by separate order.

IT IS ORDERED that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 11-A (Appendix A to Decision No. 50114, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective November 14, 1964, Fifth Revised Page 5 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

In all other respects, said Decision No. 50114, as amended shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.

They apply for the transportation of uncrated new furniture by radial highway common carriers and highway contract carriers as defined in said act.</p> <p>Rates, rules and regulations named in this tariff shall not apply to transportation by independent-contractor subhaulers when such transportation is performed for other carriers. This exception shall not be construed to exempt from the tariff provisions carriers for whom the independent contractors are performing transportation service.</p>	20
