ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

Seaport Compress Co., Inc., possesses a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a warehouseman located at Oakland. The Commission has received a letter from Seaport stating that it has ceased operations as a public utility warehouseman.

Seaport Compress Co., Inc., having discontinued service as a public utility warehouseman without proper authority, and the Commission being of the opinion and finding that such discontinuance constitutes good cause for revocation of the certificate of public convenience and necessity involved and of the tariff applicable to services thereunder,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity as a public utility warehouseman acquired by Seaport Compress Co., Inc., by Decision No. 65656 dated July 9, 1963, in Application No. 45474, is hereby revoked.

2. Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1 of Seaport Compress Company, is hereby canceled.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Seaport Compress Co., Inc., or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Seaport Compress Co., Inc., or after the above mailing, unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with this Commission a written request for a public hearing, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
